But, before I say goodbye to 2009, I would like to share a third-grade teacher's wonderful story of the difference her bucket filling has made in the life of one child:

"I have used your book, Have You Filled a Bucket Today?, since it was first published and I love it! I have a bulletin board permanently set up in my room that allows children and adults to fill buckets by writing a Post-it note with comments on it and placing it on their buckets.

At the beginning of October, I received a new student who had many behavioral issues in previous schools; severe issues with pages upon pages of meetings, interventions, and documentation.

On the second day of school, he inquired about my bucket board. I explained it to him and within 20 minutes he was busy writing a post-it note to each child in the class. He wrote 'You are cool' over and over and made a point to fill everyone's bucket. This was interesting to me because positive peer relations were something he struggled with in the past.

He did it once again three days later, writing something else like, 'You rock.' He was very excited to get notes in return and stuck them on the inside of his desktop.

The Bucket Filler Board was a very important part of his day.

Just last week he left to go to his third school this year. He had made amazing progress and I was so sad to see him go. With only a night to prepare for his good-bye, my coworker reminded me how much Bucket Filling meant to him, so she suggested I get him the book. I bought it and had all the kids write messages to him.

It was such a great keepsake and a message I hope he continues to believe in no matter how many schools he will attend in his career. I had lunch with him and a friend after giving it to him and he told me that he would like to pass it down to his kids and maybe they could pass it down to their kids.

I replied, 'Wow! You'll be a big bucketfilling family!' He smiled.

He got the message and I hope he hangs onto it for life! Thanks so much!"
