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Looking back...

First of a two-part Bucket Nugget

We've come a long way since June 2006 when we received the first printing of our book, Have You Filled a Bucket Today? A Guide to Daily Happiness for Kids. We still find it hard to believe the exciting events that were to follow.

That first summer, we were encouraged by the wonderful response to our book. which explained, in clear and simple terms, the concept of bucket filling.

Three thousand books were sold that first year (mostly to schools and at local fairs). Then, in January 2007, a representative from Hallmark Cards contacted us. They wanted to list our book in their spring catalog. This resulted in another 10,000 books sold that month in Hallmark stores across the country.

A deluge of phone calls and email quickly followed. Elementary school educators asked us to do presentations about bucket filling in their schools. They wanted their schools to be recognized as "official bucketfilling schools".

Our small group of Bucket Filler teachers and counselors began traveling in teams giving presentations across the state and nation. We produced a weekly e-newsletter and developed lesson plans to expand the bucketfilling concept. We wrote a second book for new parents, Fill a Bucket: A Guide to Daily Happiness for Young Children, and began to offer bucketfilling products to serve as reminders to fill buckets.

To date, we have distributed more than 200,000 books around the world and given 1,700 presentations in 30 states and one Canadian province. Because our mission is to create bucketfilling schools, families, and communities, we are so pleased and grateful to have come so far in such a short time.

At the close of this school year, our presentation follow-up surveys reflected a 100% satisfaction rate. Amazon.com has given both of our books a Five-Star Rating with more than 100 very positive reviews.

The bucketfilling concept has helped thousands of children and adults discover happiness and our buckets are filled with the joy of knowing that we have touched so many lives.
