The concept of the “bucket lid” has the potential to solve the growing problem of “bullycide” in our schools. Our children must understand how to use their lids to protect their buckets. They must realize that people who are mean have empty buckets and often attempt to fill them at the expense of another child’s physical and mental well-being.

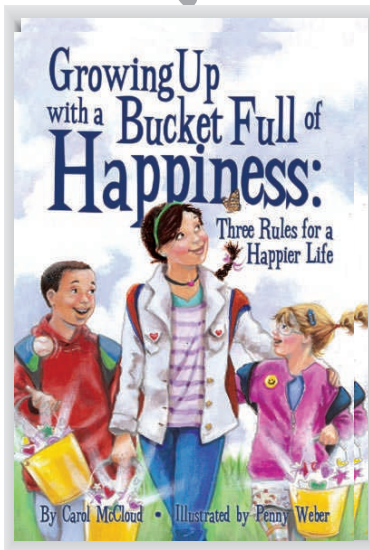
Therefore, as the new school year begins, the Bucket Fillers Team will introduce the bucketfilling concept in middle schools and offer staff presentations and products. The keystone of this exciting new program is our new book, *Growing Up with a Bucket Full of Happiness: Three Rules for a Happier Life*, a full-color chapter book for pre-teens and early teens, which will be published in the Fall of 2010.

Growing Up is filled with the captivating illustrations of Penny Weber, a very talented artist and mother of three, who lives in New York. Her colorful drawings beautifully capture the emotions of young people when their buckets are full and when they are empty. In a straightforward, practical way, *Growing Up* teaches tweens three rules for keeping their buckets filled and feeling good about themselves. *Growing Up* is filled with terminology that will resonate with this age group: “big-time bucket filling”, “long-handled dipping”, and “using your lid”. It also focuses on positive character traits: being kind, accepting responsibility, being compassionate, and explains how to make these a part of daily life.
