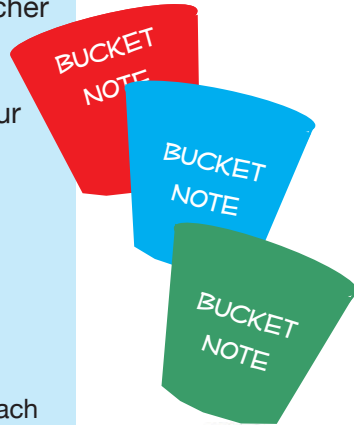

1. Purchase a small galvanized bucket and draw a cute face on it. Give it home on the corner of your desk
2. Cut out little notes in shape of buckets.
3. Use the notes throughout the week to record how each child has filled a bucket. Drop the notes in the bucket.
4. Set aside a time each Friday to read the notes to the class, giving each child a note to take home.
5. At the end of the year, purchase a mini-bucket for each child, draw a face on each one and fill it with colored slips of "note" paper. This will help them to continue filling buckets when they are away from the classroom.
